Listed below are some of the ways we can contribute. If you find yourself facing difficult circumstances, please do not hesitate to get in touch, we all need the support of others at times so don't be afraid to ask. Be assured, any assistance is given freely and with all due regard for your privacy. If we can't help directly we will do our best to find appropriate support.

Emergency food supply

We can supply food for a few days from our stocks donated by church members. We will try to deliver to your door where possible. We can also direct you to other food providers as required. For details of local food banks call 0151 638 7090 or visit wirral.foodbank.org.uk

If you're unable to get out, through self-isolating or other circumstance, we may be able to pick up food orders from local supermarkets.

Energy relief

Whilst our resources are limited, we do have some funds available to provide emergency gas and electric supply. We can assist in negotiating with energy providers if that would be helpful.

Prescriptions

If you can't get out to pick up a prescription for whatever reason, and the chemist is unable to deliver, we can collect from local pharmacies and drop off to your door.

Support and befriending

If you're finding the current situation difficult to cope with, or if you find yourself feeling isolated and would value someone to talk to, we can connect you with someone to listen, or to walk through this season with you. If additional support is needed we will try to put you in touch with appropriate organisations.

Financial concern

We can help you with budgeting, and can also put you in touch with C.A.P. (Christians Against Poverty), a recommended organisation dedicated in assisting where financial situations are serious.

Employment

Before the pandemic we were running a job club, teaching the skills needed to gain employment. We are currently exploring the possibility of an online course. If you are interested, or would like some help in a particular area (C.V., interview skills, etc.) contact Ted on the number below.
